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## VOICES IN THE HALL Carnegie Hall



A lifelong musician, **Curtis Stephan's** first experience in music formation was as a child, learning from his church organist. By the time he graduated from high school, he was skilled in guitar, piano, and trumpet. He continued his music studies at the University of North Texas (trumpet major) where he earned

a bachelor's degree in music and a master's in jazz studies. During his time at UNT, Curtis toured with the Grammynominated One O'Clock Lab Band and was awarded the Sammy Nestico Award for Big Band Jazz composition. Curtis' songs have been selected for Mass with the Pope at international youth gatherings numbering in the millions. His jazz compositions have been selected by One O'Clock Lab Band for recording, and UNT students continue to perform his music. Of all of his awards and accomplishments, Curtis is most proud of serving his parish community, leading them in worship on Sunday mornings at St. Ann Catholic Parish in Coppell, TX. He and his wife Lindsay reside in Frisco, TX with their four children.



Jesse Manibusan is a singer, songwriter, and storyteller from the San Francisco Bay Area. His heritage is CHAMoru-American (Guam) and is one of nine siblings. Jesse is a selftaught guitarist, singer, and songwriter, and has been a working musician most of his life, serving in churches, nursing homes,

schools, shelters, jails, and more. Jesse spent a great part of his formative years in the Diocese of Oakland, where much of his music was written, eventually branching out and traveling throughout the world and even different galaxies. Jesse earned a MA in Multicultural Ministries from the Franciscan School of Theology. Over the past 40 years, Jesse has traveled as an encourager and joy cultivator to audiences of every generation around the world. Jesse is a longtime partner of Oregon Catholic Press, and is also published by GIA. A father of three grown children, seven grandchildren, and one great grandchild, Jesse admits he's no spring chicken, but he's still kicking. Jesse is the recipient of many awards, but his most cherished is being voted "Entertainer of the Year," five years in a row by his mom.



A native of Berkeley, California, Janèt Sullivan Whitaker served in active parish ministry throughout the Diocese of Oakland for more than four decades. Her sacred liturgical compositions, which feature original texts and music, have come to be widely sung in Catholic Churches

throughout the world. As a Director of Music Ministries, Janèt has served many Oakland Diocese parishes. In January 2020, Janèt stepped away from full-time parish work to focus on her freelance offerings which include concerts, retreats, missions, and workshops. In addition to parish work and free-lance ministries, Janèt served for 15 summers as a musician and catechist for the One Bread and One Cup Summer Youth Liturgical Leadership Conferences. In 2021, she was a featured speaker for the Catholic/Jewish Women's Dialogue in Southern California. In 2022, Janèt joined the leadership team of the Liturgical Music Institute. In addition to her work in music ministry, Janèt is a lover of traditional hula dance, a gardener, an avid cook, and a singer of jazz and R&B music. She resides in Hayward, California with Brian Whitaker, her husband of 40 years, and their two Jack Russell terriers, Kirby and Lucy.



**Stephen Petrunak** is known nationally for his service as President and CEO of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians from 2017-2020. In addition, Stephen sat for two terms as a member of the NPM Board of Directors and as the Vice-President of the Board of Directors for the

American Guild of Music. He is also a founding member of the nonprofit Catholic Liturgical Ensemble Formation. Stephen is a guitarist, composer, instructor, arranger, clinician and author. He has recorded and produced several instrumental collections of music and authored several books for GIA Publications. Stephen has a catalog of more than 900 recorded instrumental guitar versions of popular songs across various styles and genres promoted across a myriad of download and streaming platforms. He is known locally for his work as a music instructor at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit and is currently the Director of Music at St. Blase Catholic Church in Sterling Heights, MI. Stephen lives with his wife Ruth in Washington, MI.


